After reviewing congregational life and seeking to determine community needs, a workshop with the congregation was held at Newport on 17th November 2012.

At this meeting it was agreed that two Marks of Mission should be our priority in the next three years.

# Mark 8 – Serve the community in practical ways: reaching out to others, especially those in need Mark 9 - Ready to Seek Growth and Cast the Net

The Mission Planning Group (MPG) first met prior to the Workshop in November and then with the CTN facilitators on 9th January 2013 to gather ideas. The MPG met again to shape the Mission Action Plan (MAP), which was considered by the Vestry on 23rd February and then by congregation on 10th March. Final approval was given by Vestry at a special meeting on 4th April 2013.

This is a "living document" that may have to be changed after the Rector retires in 2014, when we face the challenge inherent in the subsequent interregnum. Hence in January 2014 a review will begin of some of the Rector's work in order to find and encourage members of the congregation to carry this forward wherever possible. [The Rector's Incumbency was extended by the Bishop to September 2015]

The MAP, together with a new Charge Profile, will be used to demonstrate to possible candidates for the incumbency that St Mary's is thriving and wishes to move forward spiritually and in mission and outreach under the continuing guidance of the Holy Spirit.
